What challenges the government faces in preparing a concrete public document comprising inputs, outputs, and outcomes of a public policy? Take an India example of a public policy to justify your answer.	20
2	The episode of Ms. Durga Shakti Nagpal, IAS, while serving as Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) of Noida in Uttar Pradesh, who was assertive and took strong action against illegal sand mining, a practice that not only violated environmental regulations but also led to significant economic losses for the State. Her strict enforcement of the law, however, brought her into a direct conflict with powerful vested interests that enjoyed political patronage. In 2013, she was suspended on the pretext of allegedly demolishing a mosque wall, a charge later proven baseless. This incident exposed the vulnerability of honest officers who, despite acting within the ambit of the law, often face punitive actions such as transfers, suspensions, and false allegations. Such cases highlight the systemic issue of political interference undermining the autonomy and morale of civil servants.	20
